From its base in the market town of Richmond in the Yorkshire Dales, the company has been entertaining audiences from Shropshire to the Scottish Borders since 1995.

For more than 15 years, supported by Arts Council England, North Country Theatre's hilarious ripping yarns, moving historical dramas and educational work have been a vital part of the cultural life of towns and villages in the rural north.

#### **Touring Productions**

Artistic Director Nobby Dimon has created and written over 20 new plays. These range from adaptations of well known novels such as *The Lost World*, and the Olivier award winning *The 39 Steps*, modern classics such as J. L. Carr's *A Month in the Country* to specially researched original pieces such as *Home on the Range* telling the epic story of daleswomen on the Oregon Trail. We have more in the pipeline we'd like to do.

#### **Community Plays**

He has also written and directed three large scale community plays where professional actors work with large casts of local people on a play with special local resonance ~ The Passion Plays, Mak the Sheepstealer with its 'flash mob heavenly choir' and Last Dance of a Dalesman about the end of lead mining. We have an idea for a new community play based on the Burning of Bartle and Reeth Bartle Fair.



#### **Educational and Site Specific Work**

Each year the company also works with about 800 primary school children at places like Fountains Abbey and Hall and The Dales Countryside Museum. Children in rural schools need theatre and drama just as much as those in urban areas.

We have also created site specific interpretations for visitors to sites like Rievaulx Abbey and Brodsworth Hall, Lindisfarne and Richmond Castle helping to bring history and landscape alive and contributing to the tourist economy.

## How you can keep the show on the road

Many people have asked how they can help North Country Theatre to continue to produce its much valued programme of work now that it no longer has the regular support of Arts Council England. #### Be an ANGEL

North Country Angels pledge to donate a minimum of £100 a year for the next three years. By knowing what money will be coming in, on top of the earned income, we will be able to budget sensibly and plan productions and educational work to suit. Just 400 angels could replace all our lost arts council funding.

#### A Host of Angels

A group of friends or colleagues, a school, a parish council, or a village hall committee can buy into the scheme as a group.

Angels will be credited on our website and in programmes (unless you prefer not) and receive our newsletters and

information, and receive an annual "report" from the Artistic Director.

Between 5,000 – 8,000 people enjoy a North Country production each year or are involved with our education work for the National Trust and English Heritage. 
### Ioin the FRIENDS of **North Country Theatre**

# How will we use your support?

#### Over the next 3 years, with your help we can:

- Create two new touring productions for village halls across the region.
   (One a new comedy thriller based on the crime fiction of Yorkshire writer J. S. Fletcher)
- Commission and produce another Community Play for Richmondshire to be performed in 2013 with the participation of 100 volunteers
- Bring history alive for more than 2000 primary school children in site specific dramas and school visits
- Help the North to celebrate the return of the Lindisfarne Gospels by designing and facilitating labyrinth walks for English Heritage which explore Celtic/Anglo-Saxon art and culture

#### and here are some typical costs...

- Actors it costs about £7,500 to employ each actor for a tour
- The van costs about £3,500 a year to fuel and keep on the road
- Set designs, making and materials cost about £4000
- Props & costumes –making and hire & other production costs £2000

**North Country Theatre** is a not-for-profit company run by a volunteer board. It is registered as a company limited by guarantee but not as a charity. It has only one full time employee, a part time office manager, and an office in Richmond.
